Polling place: the building or area in which polling distions are situated Polling places are normally within the polling distict unless it is not possible to find a suitable place within the area or it is more convenient for the majority of voters. Certain types of buildings are not normally designated as polling places, f example, places of worship and licensed premises and schools are only used where there is no reasonable alternative in order to avoid disruption to pupils education.

Polling station: the room or area within the polling place where voting tak place. The number of polling stations in a polling place depends on the number and distribution of electors in the polling district.
